NASPGHAN PLANNING UPDATE

The North American Society for Pediatric Gastroenterology, Hepatology & Nutrition (NASPGHAN) annual meeting will be November 1-4, 2017 in Las Vegas, Nevada. PG-SIG Past Co-Chairs Amanda Deacy, PhD and Michele Maddux, PhD were invited by the current NASPGHAN President to attend the NASPGHAN planning committee meeting in January 2017. There, Drs. Deacy and Maddux advocated with conference planners for a more integrated program, such that psychology speakers would be invited to present on behavioral and psychosocial aspects of common pediatric GI conditions, also being discussed by leading medical experts in these areas. To date, six psychologists have been invited to present as part of the 2017 NASPGHAN conference program. In addition, Drs. Deacy and Maddux have worked with the Association of Pediatric Gastroenterology and Nutrition Nurses (APGNN) to identify psychology co-presenters for their discipline-specific programming.
