Poster Award Winner

Congratulations to Caroline Roberts from Oklahoma State University! She has been selected as the poster award winner for the PG-SIG, for her poster entitled, "Illness Stigma, Communication Difficulties, Social Belongingness, and Depressive Symptoms in Youth with IBD."

Article Review

Gamwell and colleagues (2018) conducted a cross-sectional study investigating psychosocial factors associated elevated depressive symptoms in youth with IBD. Eighty youth completed self-report measures of illness stigma, thwarted (social) belongingness, and depressive symptoms. Findings indicate significant relations between illness stigma and thwarted belongingness/depression symptoms and mediation analyses suggested that higher levels of illness sigma were related to a lower sense of social belongingness, which in turn, was associated with elevated depressive symptoms.
